Enrollment Benefits

Benefits for the sponsor/family include:

Tricare ECHO, if they qualify.

Respite care if they meet eligibility criteria. (Categories 4/5 or LON)

Possible priority placement on Navy housing waitlist. (Categories 4/5)

Lessens unnecessary family separations — flag for detailer.

Family support — connection to resources via an assigned case liaison. (I&R/non-clinical case management)

The EFM is identified through medical diagnosis, by school personnel or by family self-referral.

The sponsor provides the EFMP enrollment package (DD Form 2792 & 2792-1, if applicable) to medical providers and school professionals to complete, sign and date.

The sponsor gives completed enrollment package (can include IEP. IFSP as applicable) to the MTF EFMP coordinator who reviews and uploads package to NFAAS for review by the CSC.

The CSC reviews the EFMP enrollment package and provides a recommendat ion to PERS 456 EFMP Branch. PERS 456

reviews the

Enrollment must be updated every three years. Requires submitting updated paper-work via the EFMP MTF coordinator (with exceptions).

EFMP Case Liaisons



EFMP case liaisons are CNIC employees located at FFSCs and are the Family Support component of the EFMP. They provide:

Quarterly contact with information, referrals and resources.

Non-clinical case management, including family needs assessments and family services plans.

Help with explaining the EFMP enrollment/disenrollment process.

Special education support, such as reviewing IEPs and/or attending IEP meetings with parents.

Referrals to EFMP special education attorneys as needed.

EFMP case liaisons also provide:

EFMP command POC training.

A warm handoff to the gaining EFMP office.

Education and training to families and commands.

Outreach to engage families and promote the EFMP.

Effective October 2024, all enlisted Sailors enrolled in EFMP that are within 12-months of there projected rotation date will negotiate for orders via MyNavy Assignment.


